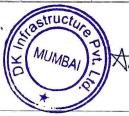

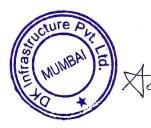

Notes to the Standalone Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March, 2024

Note 1:

A. General Information:

The Company, M/s DK Infrastructure Private Limited (undergoing Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process) (CIN: U45203MH2008PTC178804) (hereinafter referred to as "the company") with its principal place of business at Mumbai (Maharashtra) was carrying on the business-related to Infrastructure projects like EPC projects Construction, widening etc of Road, Bridges, Government Building etc. The company was also involved in the similar nature of Infrastructure Projects in the states of Rajasthan, Haryana, Tripura, Uttarakhand, and Karnataka & Goa.

B. Initiation of Corporate Insolvency Process (CIRP):

The Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process ("CIRP") was initiated by an application filed under Section 9 of the Insolvency & Bankruptcy Code ("IBC") before Hon'ble National Company Law Tribunal, Mumbai Bench ("NCLT").

The Hon'ble NCLT, vide its order dated 17th April 2023 ("CIRP Commencement Date") commenced the CIRP of the Company and Mr. Jayanti Lal Jain having IBBI registration number: IBBI/IPA-001/IP-P01792/2019-2020/12845, has been appointed as the Interim Resolution Professional ("IRP") by the said order. Upon commencement of CIRP, a moratorium has been imposed under Section 14 of IBC and shall be in effect till the completion of the CIRP.

The IRP has called for claims from various creditors of the Company and based on the claims received, the Committee of Creditors ("COC") has been formed. In the first meeting of the COC held on 17th May 2023, the COC passed a resolution to appoint the IRP as the Resolution Professional ("RP") to conduct the CIRP. As per the provisions of IBC, the powers of the Board of Directors stand suspended effective from the CIRP Commencement Date, and such powers are vested with the IRP/RP in accordance with Section 17 and 23 of IBC.

Part of these financial statements pertain to the prior CIRP period and the IRP/RP has been managing the affairs of the Company from 17.04.2023 onwards. Thus, the suspended Directors have signed these financial statements with the permission of the RP. It must be noted that the RP, nor his professional advisors, consultants, service providers, affiliates, directors, employees, agents, representatives shall be liable for any damages, whether direct or indirect, incidental, special or consequential including loss of revenue or profits that may arise from or in connection the said financial results.

The RP has signed these financial statements without prejudice and without any guarantee of the accuracy, adequacy, correctness, completeness or reliability of the financial statements as the same pertains to period prior to the CIRP Commencement Date.



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Note 2: - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements of the Company are prepared under historical cost convention in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) applicable in India and the accounting standards and statements issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis under the historical cost convention. The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the previous year.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013 based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realization of cash and cash equivalents. The Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current – non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

B. USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/materialized.

C. REVENUE RECOGNITION

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. The Company recognizes revenue when the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of the Company's activities as described below. The Company bases its estimates on historical results, taking into consideration the type of customer, the type of transaction and the specifics of each arrangement.

(i) Revenue from Infrastructure activities:

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured and such Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. The Company recognizes revenue when the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of the Company's activities. During the Financial Year in 2023-2024 company received Rs. 11,34,65,423/- (Previous Year FY 2022-2023: Rs. 37,02,33,504/-).

(ii) Interest Income:

Interest income is recorded as and when accrued.

D. INVENTORY

(i) Raw Materials:

Raw Materials, construction materials and stores & spares are valued at weighted average cost or net realizable value, whichever is lower. Cost includes all charges in bringing the materials to the place of usage, excluding refundable duties and taxes.

(ii) Work in Progress:

Work-in-Progress is valued at the contracted rates less profit margin / estimates.

(iii) Properties Under Development:

Properties under development, if any, are valued at cost or net realizable value, whichever is lower. Cost comprises all direct development expenditure, administrative expenses and borrowing costs.

E. Property Plant & Equipment's - FIXED ASSETS - TANGIBLE & INTANGIBLE

Fixed assets are stated at their original cost net of tax/duty credits availed, if any, less accumulated depreciation. Administrative and other general overhead expenses that are specifically attributable to construction or acquisition of fixed assets or bringing the fixed assets to working condition are allocated and capitalized as a part of the cost of the fixed assets. In the case of new projects and in case of substantial modernization or expansion, expenditure incurred including interest on borrowings and financing costs of specific loans, prior to commencement of commercial production is capitalized to the cost of assets. Trial Run Expenditures were also capitalized.

Under Tangible Assets company only held Office Equipment like Computers and Printers in its name. other than the same, no other Assets were existing in the name and in possession of the company. Accordingly, a fair recognition by the management was done in the Previous Year ended on 31.03.2023 about such fixed assets which were not in existence and / or are impaired. Thereafter during the FY 2023-24 assets worth Rs 84,000/- were acquired by the Company.

F. DEPRECIATION & IMPAIRMENT OF ASSETS:

Depreciation is provided on written down value method over the useful life of the assets based on the life of assets as prescribed in Part C of Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

In respect of additions or extensions forming an integral part of existing assets and insurance spares, including incremental cost arising on account of translation of foreign currency liabilities for acquisition of Fixed Assets, if any, depreciation is provided over the residual life of the respective assets.

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Since substantial and complete evaluation and resultant impairment of Fixed assets has been already recognized and accounted in the books of accounts in the previous financial year ended on 31.03.2023.

G. TAXES ON INCOME

Current tax

Current Tax is recognized based on assessable profit computed in accordance with the Income Tax Act, 1961 and at the prevailing tax rates.

Minimum Alternate Tax

Minimum Alternate Tax (MAT) calculated in accordance with tax laws, which give rise to future economic benefits in the form of adjustment of future tax liability, is recognized as an asset only when, based on convincing evidence, it is probable that future economic benefits associated with it will flow to the Company and the assets can be measured reliably.

H. BORROWING COST

General and specific borrowing costs directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets, which are assets that necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use, are added to the cost of those assets, until such time the assets are substantially ready for their intended use. All other borrowing costs are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss in the period in which they are incurred.

The Credit facilities from ICICI Bank Ltd & Axis Bank Ltd were categorized as NPA since the year 2023-2024, hence Interest amount on such loans and credit facilities was not charged in the loan accounts during the financial year 2023-2024 excluding pre-CIRP period.

I. PROVISIONS AND CONTINGENCIES:

The company creates a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of past events that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made, where there is a possible obligation or a present obligation that probably will not require an outflow of resources or where a reliable estimate of obligation cannot be made.

The company has issued the Bank Guarantee from ICICI Bank Ltd & Axis Bank Ltd, for its various projects during the previous years which were invoked or closed for different reasons such as non-extension, non-renewal or non-performance or maturity of tenure etc.

Further the company had estimated on an approximate basis about the impact and outcome of various liabilities with regards to taxation under Income Tax, GST, ROC compliances, labour laws etc. including the expected amount of interest and penalty thereon. The amount of Contingent Liabilities is quantified in Note *No.16 of the financial statements*. Such an amount of Contingent liabilities is quantified on an estimated basis.

After the commencement date of CIRP, the RP has received the claims both from financial creditors and operational creditors as per the claims invited by the IRP/RP. The company anticipated the outcome of different liabilities such as Statutory and Taxation including GST, Income Tax, TDS and other Labour laws etc. and have quantified the tentative amount to be the **Contingent Liabilities** and its consequential impact on its financial position.

Out of the listed Contingent Liabilities some of them respectively have been crystalized in view of guarantee-cum-indemnity issued by the company being invoked and corresponding claims being filed before the IRP/RP before signing of the financial statements. Though such claims received have not been given accounting treatment in the books of accounts and hence continue to be reflected in 'Contingent Liabilities' until the completion of the CIRP proceedings.

J. INVESTMENTS

Investments are classified into current and long-term investments (Non-current Investments). Current investments are stated at the lower of cost and fair value. Long-term investments are stated at cost. A provision for diminution is made to recognize a decline, other than temporary, separately for each individual long-term investment.

K. EARNINGS PER SHRE

The basic earnings per share ("EPS") for the year is computed by dividing the net profit/ (loss) after tax for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the period attributable to the equity shareholders of the Company and weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per equity share and also the weighted average number of equity shares that could have been issued upon conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

L. CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

In the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, term deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

5. Bad and Doubtful Debts / Receivables: Rs. 344.85 Lakh (Previous Year : Rs. 1,110.41 Lakh)

Since over a period of time there were huge outstanding amount receivables in the nature of Debtors and Receivables and after all the efforts and deliberations made by the management, it was realized that such amount was not in position to be realized hence during the financial year 2023-2024, it was Written-Off in the books of accounts as "Bad & Doubtful Debts" considering and recognizing such amount being non-recoverable from respective parties.

6. Doubtful Debts: Rs. 251.02 Lakh (Previous Year: Rs. 4,412.93 Lakh)

The company while recognizing the realizability of respective debtors which were long outstanding for one or the other reasons including compliance issues and different parameters and its expected time frame and resources' required in order to realize the same, hence the management has written off such doubtful debts in the books of accounts in the financial year 2023-2024, based on their reasonable estimate and assumptions as per experience of over past 16 years of being in the Infrastructure business and dealing with the respective customers and authorities from whom such amount was receivable.



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Such receivable amounts for the previous financial year 2022-2023, included the amount receivables in the form of Deductions / Amount withheld/ Retention money / Security deposits / unclaimed amounts / Penalty imposed by the different authorities. Further such amount also included amounts being advanced and recoverable from parties which were responsible for project executions and in the capacity of Subcontractor or Job-worker who failed to return the amount to the company in time leading to complete blockage of working capital and also the financial stress over period of past 3 to 4 years.

7. Loss on Encashment of Bank Guarantee: Rs. Nil (Previous Year: Rs. Nil)

Bank Guarantee (BG of Rs.87.88 Lakh) was issued by the company from Axis Bank Ltd, from and within their sanctioned BG limit & applicable BG commission respectively. Such BG was invoked by the Beneficiary named RUDSICO, Udaipur in the financial year 2024-2025 which is post Balance sheet event and such amount will be accordingly charged to expenses in the financial year 2024-2025 in the books of accounts being "Loss on encashment of Bank Guarantee". The amount of the encashed amount of BG would be debited to the cash credit account of the company by Axis Bank Ltd resulting into the increase of the debit balance of the CC account. The non-cash claim was converted to cash claim and the total claim as submitted by the Axis Bank Ltd remained unchanged.

8. Loss on Impairment of Investment: Rs. 7.08 Lakh (Previous Year: Rs. 599. 39 Lakh)

The company has made investment in different entities over period of time. Further such carrying amount of Investment as on previous year ended on 31.03.2023, has been valued on the basis of financial position of the respective entity based on their last financial statements as available and loss on impairment of investment has been accounted by the management to arrive at fair value of such investment amount. This gives fair reflection of the value of amount of such investments at balance sheet date of the previous year ended 31.03.2023. Similarly recognition for **Rs. 7.08 Lakh** was done in the financial year 2023-2024.

9. Sundry Balances Written Off/Written Back: Rs 15.91 Lakh (Previous Year: Rs. Nil)

Since the management intends to present the appropriate position as regards to the accounts and amounts based on its realizability and expected event of its probable payment it has thoroughly visited and re-visited on each and every account and respective amount and it was accordingly found that substantial amount of such receivable and payable amount were to be recognized as not being expected to be received and similarly not being expected to be paid either. Hence it was decided by the

management in the financial year 2023-2024, to write- off / write- back such amount respectively as the company doesn't foresee any possibility of such amounts being payable or receivable any more in future.

Such receivable amounts for the previous financial year 2022-2023, included the amount receivables in the form of Deductions / Amount withheld/ Retention money / Security deposits / unclaimed amounts / Penalty imposed by the different authorities. Further such amount also included amounts being advanced and recoverable from parties which were responsible for project executions and in the capacity of Subcontractor or Job-worker who failed to return the amount to the company in time leading to complete blockage of working capital and also the financial stress over period of past 3 to 4 years.

Similarly the accounts payable included the corresponding payable amounts due to creditors / provision for expenses and other liabilities. The management has deliberated on such liabilities and have ultimately decided to write them back in the books considering and recognizing them to be Not payable any more.

10. Impairment & Loss on Fixed Assets: Nil (Previous Year: Rs. 117.08 Lakh)

Since the company was under huge financial stress including loan accounts and credit facilities being overdue and NPA in Banks and financial institutions and further due to the reason of Project Losses at respective site and locations, it was necessary to recognize the factual position and availability of respective fixed assets and it was found and ascertained that majority of the fixed assets including Plant & Machinery and Construction equipments' suffered Huge Impairment. Accordingly, a fair recognition by the management was done for the year ended on 31.03.2023 about such fixed assets which are not in existence and / or are impaired. Hence a loss or Impairment of Fixed assets was recognized in the books of accounts amounting to Rs. 117.08 Lakh during the previous financial year 2022-2023 (Current year: Nil)

11. Regarding Cash Losses incurred:

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The company has incurred huge Cash Losses in the financial year 2022-2023 & 2023-2024, resulting in the substantial erosion of the Capital and Networth of the company. The management and company are making best efforts to revive the company and also tried and introduced capital through unsecured loans from Directors in FY 2022-2023 and are further continued exploring new avenues to generate the business and to get the company out of such financial distress. As the Company is under CIRP it is expected that a viable resolution plan will be approved as and when received and evaluated, accordingly results have been prepared on "going concern" basis.

The major reasons identified among other reasons by the management for such huge losses in last couple of years was as under:

- a. Project Losses suffered over period of past 2-3 viz. from FY 2020-2021 to FY 2022-2023
- b. Taking on multiple large sized projects without comprehensive and sustainable planning like Jalore BOT.
- c. Discontinuance of Projects by the Department / Authorities such as Short Closing of the Projects and / or descoping of the projects by Departments.
- d. Changes in the Govt Guidelines and non-realization of debtors & receivables in due time
- e. Impact of COVID-19 pandemic resulting in hinderances in projects
- f. Delay / non-availability in arrangement of necessary working capital finance at appropriate time
- g. Availing funds of high interest bearing loans from lenders.
- h. Encashment of Bank guarantees and related huge finance costs imposed leading to irrecoverable expenses contributing to the existing losses.
- i. Financial stress and overdue credit facilities being declared as NPA by financiers.
- j. Blockage of working capital due to non-realization of Debtors / advances
- k. Failure on part of Sub-contractors and Job-worker in completing and delivering projects on time, which in turn hampered the realizability of project receipts in due time.
- l. Loss & Impairment of Fixed assets and the losses on project sites and locations etc.
- m. Disputes evolved within the associates and sub-contractors of the company hampering the timely completion of the projects and delivering.
- n. Delay and non-availability of work fronts in time leading to loss of resources at project site and loss of plant and equipment and machineries.
- o. Absence of any alternate planning in the unforeseen events of project stoppage or project losses.
- p. Non availability of sufficient and sustainable own assets' based which would have been proved to be better cushion in the evet of financial distress.
- q. Dependency on selective Sub-contractors and Job-workers and / or suppliers etc.
- r. Non availability of appropriate expert resources to handle the project and related crises leading to losses
- s. Attachments from Statutory authorities on the bank accounts and Debtors & Receivables amounts resulting in complete blockage of operations of the company.
- t. Losses incurred due to theft, consumption losses, seasonal impact and other unforeseen events
- Failure of efforts to restructure the credit facilities with Axis Bank Ltd, ICICI Bank Ltd, Standard Chartered Bank and Religare Finvest Ltd proposal of Restructuring during Covid-19 pandemic.

12. Regarding Litigations for the Amount of Taxes in disputes:

The company as an attempt to deny and reduce the liabilities, has raised disputes against the Income tax assessments as well as GST assessments during the course of assessment and subsequent stages respectively which had impact on the increase of taxation liabilities on the company. There were many factors responsible beyond the control of company and its management which resulted in the tax demand against the company. Some of them are listed below:

a. That during previous years in the course of assessment proceedings Company couldn't avail the opportunity provided to furnish the details and documents and information due to many un-avoidable circumstances and situations beyond

- **b.** That due to the covid pandemic all of the company and its operations and management were badly hampered which led to the delay in filing submissions during the course of assessment proceedings in the past as well as to file some of the subsequent appeal before the CIT(Appeals).
- c. That the new Income tax portal as well as GST implementations was under development which lead to slight inconvenience and difficult particularly to navigate about the "e-proceedings' module in the limited time as available and assessee unsuccessfully tried to updated itself with the notices issued and to augment itself with the appeal filing process leading to delay.
- **d.** That while some of the assessment orders of Income tax and / or GST were finalised based on the limited submissions by the assessee leading to substantial tax demands in the respective orders.
- **e.** That the assessment was finalised without considering and appreciating the facts of the case and submissions of documents and information as per the limited reply made by the company
- **f.** That majority of the outstanding demands of Income Tax & GST were of FY2014-2015 to FY2018-2019, due to re-opening of previous assessment cases wherein the company was incorporated on continuing basis and efforts and submissions were made to inform the facts but those were not appreciated and accepted by respective authorities of Income tax or GST.
- **g.** Similarly, investigations were conducted by GST Mumbai and Bangalore with levy of heavy demands on suo moto basis without considering the submissions made during and post such investigations. Company has filed a Writ Petition before Hon'ble High Court, Mumbai against such investigations which are not conducted as per the legal procedures.
- **h.** That the additions to Income were done suo-moto by the authorities inspite of company tried to explain with the necessary documents and information about the issues raised but it was not appreciated and accepted due to paucity of time.
- i. That in addition to covid pandemic and its bad effects on the directors and their family members and staff all were infected as well as some were hospitalised for substantial period. Further with the very limited staff and resources was not able to work for many months' because of hospitalisation due to different reasons, leading to delayed filings of appeals in Income tax and GST, though they were filed with request to condone the delay with availing the opportunity on natural justice so that the assessee can avail one last chance to submit their submissions against the respective orders passed and to try and explain its details and affairs with available justifications and necessary documentations as an genuine attempt to reduce the Tax impact as assessed against the company in Income Tax & GST.
- **j.** That due to lack of proper submissions due to un-availed opportunity the company could not make the necessary submissions and explanation which lead to additions during the assessments. Hence company requested and sought more opportunity to add and submit additional facts during the course of hearings before the subsequent and higher authorities in the during the course of Appeals Proceedings.



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13. Regarding CIRP Cost: The Lender who has filed the application u/s 9 of IBC viz - M/s. Kalindi Green Ventures has contributed an amount of Rs.2,00,000 as advance amount as per the order of Hon'ble NCLT order towards the CIRP costs.
